



INTRODUCTION

The impact of the pandemic on students' literacy skills has been substantial. According to *The Education Recovery Scorecard*, a 2024 report co-authored by Harvard and Stanford, experts anticipate that it will take 2 years to close the 3rd-grade reading achievement gap.

The most vulnerable learners, who were already struggling to keep up before the pandemic, have been hit the hardest. This underscores the urgent need for effective intervention strategies. The Education Recovery Scorecard highlights that the largest pandemic-related achievement gap is between high- and low-poverty districts, with students in the highest-poverty districts experiencing a sharp decline in achievement—42 percent loss of grade level for reading and up to 70 percent in math.

Despite the willingness, effort, and talent of educators, many schools struggle to effectively serve students due to a lack of effective strategies and scalable tools.
